Assessment Notes

The examiner has assessed your **overall performance** based on the markings shown in columns A and B. Using this measurement **a final assessment for each phase** has been made against the criteria below and these grades are shown at the foot of column A.

Criteria for Grading

- Overall performance to a very high standard with no significant instructional weaknesses.
- A good overall standard of instruction with some minor weakness in instructional technique.
- A competent overall performance with some minor deficiencies in instructional technique.
- An inadequate overall performance with some deficiencies in instructional technique.
- A poor overall performance with numerous deficiencies in instructional technique.
- Overall standard of instruction extremely poor or dangerous with incorrect or even dangerous instruction.

The minimum level for a PASS is a Grade 4 in each phase. You must achieve a satisfactory grade in each phase on the same occasion to obtain an overall pass in the examination.

Appeals

You have no grounds to appeal against the examiner's decision just because you don't agree with it. But if you consider that your test was not properly conducted in accordance with the Regulations you may apply to a Magistrates Court in the area in which you reside (in Scotland to the Sheriff within whose jurisdiction you reside) which has power to determine this point. Should the Court find that the test was not properly conducted they may order a refund of the fee. (See Road Traffic Act 1988, Section 133).

You should note, however, that your right of appeal to the Court under section 133 is strictly limited to the question of whether the test was properly conducted in accordance with the Regulations.

Before you consider making any appeal you may wish to seek legal advice.
